





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Report on access to District Property, via Roadway off of Hildreth Street.

The action on Article 21 was referred back for a report to the May 2007 Annual. This was to provide access for a piece of land owned by Albert J Gagnon Jr. of 2104 Lakeview Avenue Dracut MA.

In particular this parcel was in fact abutted to by land now or formerly of the Gagnon Family. This rear parcel was divided off and access at one time was or could have been via the front parcel.

The applicant now approaches the District for authorization to use, as access, the District Roadway leading to the Hildreth Street Well field AKA New Boston Well Field.

The family had sold the front parcel of land, not recording or allowing access to the rear parcel, effectively "land locking" their rear parcel.

Notwithstanding other legal options to the applicant the issue now to be reported on is the request for use of the "Well Field Roadway" as access and frontage to this rear parcel. Insofar as this is concerned staff after reviewing this, the survey done and issues surrounding public use of the Well Field Road now must consider the following:

- 1. Liability exposure of the District for any an all authorized use of this Roadway.
- 2. Increase vehicular traffic in an environmentally sensitive area
- 3. Security issues of the gate and fence currently installed as well as the upgrade required by the Board for permanent fencing and gating.
- 4. The increased potential for use of the well field roadways and areas as they abut this lot.

Considering the real potential for suit, injury and accident as well as the potential for a precedent which others would then be entitled to apply for it is regretful but staff recommends that the petition not be considered. That no person shall be granted access for routine use of any District property as it is not in the interest of the District to create a potential for suit regarding such authorized use.

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



Report of William "Zee" Zielinski Water Commissioner

To the ratepayers of the Dracut Water Supply District;

I take great pride in being a representative of your water supply District. Once again, a new season begins and another productive year is on the verge of commencing. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for allowing me to be one of the three water commissioners representing your interests here at the District.

The District is rapidly undertaking significant improvements to the Tyngsboro Well Field after suffering significant losses associated with the Flood of May 2006. With the completion of these upgrades, the residents of the District can be assured of many more years of a top quality water supply.

The District continued in the partnership policy of working with local developers by completely upgrading our K Street Booster Pump Station. New state of the art pumps, automatic controls, back up emergency power and the installation of a new fire pump system will vastly improve the Passaconaway supply area. This will provide increased water pressures, flows and fire protection standards far greater than what was formerly available. The cost of this state of the art upgrade was done without expense to the District but was paid for by the developer requiring water service for homes and fire protection which then required these improvements to be made.

Planning is continuing for the construction of a new booster pump station located in the Tyngsboro water supply area. Construction is anticipated to begin late summer of 2007 and completion by the end of 2008. This new station will increase pressures and flows in the area and also provide for an increase in the ability to draw on more of our own supply from our Tyngsboro wells.

The District will continue its hydrant flushing program during the spring and fall of 2007. As this program continues to evolve, those deficiencies that are discovered shall be corrected and upgraded to current American Water Works standards. This program will continue with your support of a funding article being proposed to you, the ratepayer, at this year's Annual District Meeting. In addition, the ratepayer's will be asked to support an article that will fund additional security measures needed to help protect our two well fields from trespassers who could threaten the pristine quality of water the District currently enjoys.

As always, your thoughts and concerns regarding the water you purchase and consume is paramount to me. I'd like to thank all of you who continue to support the efforts here at the District and I applaud those of you who have brought up ideas for discussion and your thoughts regarding our Water System. See you around Town.

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Our system has seen the completion of another connection to the neighboring water system for emergency use. Report of the Executive Director-Superintendent Gary W. McCarthy Annual Report 2006

As this fiscal year ends for the Annual Report (June 30th 2006) once again I am pleased to report that the Dracut Water Supply District is financially sound, the distribution system in ever improving condition and new exciting projects underway.

In the past year I have again seen tremendous improvements and new exciting projects on the schedule for the upcoming year.

We have completed the interconnection to a third water source (Town of Methuen) via the new 12" transmission line to now connect our system to this source so in the event of emergencies or extraordinary high demands water is available. This was a tremendous accomplishment for both the Town of Dracut and the Dracut Water Supply District which was part of a public/private endeavor.

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This year too we will complete repairs and new protection projects that were shown to be much needed by the recent flooding that impacted the entire Merrimack Valley. A significant portion should be covered by government grants.

Our efforts on replacing undersized mains completed over four thousand feet with another almost five thousand feet going out to bid for the construction season of 2007. While certainly this causes lots of inconvenience during the process it will return benefits in fire protection, increased flows and enhanced water quality that will make this temporary inconvenience minor in comparison to the long term return.

Our entire system has been refitted with new meter reading devices and we are able to deliver more accurate and timely reads which no longer require estimates.

We continue to provide credits to those accounts which conserve as well as our "Senior Citizen" Discount program for our water ratepayers who qualify.

I am also thankful for all the tremendous support and grateful for the many positive words I receive during the course of my travels throughout the District. I, along with my Staff which makes all of this possible, as well as our Commissioners remain committed to maintain the high standards and performance levels that have turned the District around these past few years.


I am confident that this will continue and our District will remain financially sound, fiscally responsible and ever mindful of our duties and responsibilities to you our ratepayers.


