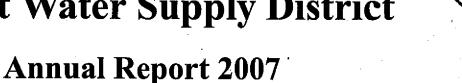

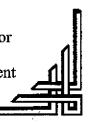

Report of Robert E. Corey Dracut Water Commissioner

I am pleased to again report to the rate payers and customers of the Dracut Water Supply District in this the start of my second term as one of your elected commissioners.

It has been a pleasure working with the staff of the District bringing about the phenomenal changes to date and to see the continued success that we are bringing to our District.

The District as of June 30th 2007 is seeing the completion of the new meter station that will add service to the eastern part of our District and connect to a new source of water. This source will provide yet another layer of protection and service to our system.

We are upgrading our facilities and refurbishing water sources to continue to remain as independent of other sources as possible and keep our rates competitive.

In our continued efforts to replace mains we will again go out to bid for almost one mile, over 5,000 feet, of new mains. This will increase services to many more homes, place new hydrants and eliminate aged lines that no longer support the demands of our customers.

I, along with the Commissioners and Staff, continue to streamline and improve water quality functions within our system. Security, system monitoring, well enhancements and strong fiscal responsibility has kept the District rates competitive while being mindful of maintenance needs.

We continue to support our seniors and customers conserving with discounts offered on these accounts. I encourage all customers to use our precious resource wisely and to conserve where possible. Water restriction devices, compliance with outside watering guidelines along with good household water use management will keep our system supplies ever available.

Report of William "Zee" Zielinski Water Commissioner

To the ratepayers of the Dracut Water Supply District;

Again I take great pride at being a representative of your water supply District. Time continues to move on by as the reconstruction of the District continues at a very aggressive pace. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all the ratepayers for allowing me to be one of three water commissioners representing your interests here at the District.

The District continues to move forward with significant improvements to the Tyngsboro Well field with the reconstruction of wells and other facilities after the floods of 2006 and 2007. Planning is now underway for the upgrade of existing treatment facilities to better serve the ratepayers of the DWSD. The District is also making improvement to the New Boston Well Field with the construction on a new ground water well. This represents the first new well constructed since 1976. With the completion of these upgrades, residents of Dracut and Tyngsboro can be assured of many more years of a top quality water supply.

The District continues to work toward construction of a new booster pump station to be located in the Tyngsoboro water supply area. The District has been successful in securing easement rights to begin construction of this station during the 2008 season with completion by the end of 2009. Once again, the construction of this facility represents the continued partnership of working with local developers participating in the construction of this station at no cost to the ratepayers of the District. Once this new station comes on line, it will represent the fourth booster pump station constructed in the District in the last nine years. This station will complete the master plan of providing equal water pressure throughout the water supply district that was envisioned ten years ago.

I am happy to report that the District has just recently accepted the final phase associated with the addition of the Meadow Creek Golf Course development in acquiring the Broadway Rd. meter station. This station along with the Marsh Hill Booster pump station represents the final connection to providing the District with a back-up water source from the Town of Methuen. This was a project that began in 1998. With the addition of this new meter station plans are now underway to retrofit this meter station to become a fifth booster station during the 2008/09 season. Once completed, this new station will provide a back-up water supply to the District in the advent of problems associated with our two well fields in the Towns of Dracut and Tyngsboro.

The District will continue its much successful hydrant flushing program in the spring and fall of 2008, a program first established in the spring of 1998. This program will further improve the quality of water supplied to the residents of Dracut and Tyngsboro especially during the high demand months of June through August of each year. The District hopes to continue to expand its hydrant replacement program thought the continued funding established for a hydrant program at the annual meeting of 2007. Again ratepayers will

be asked to support funding for this article during the 2008 Annual meeting so this program may continue this important effort so vital in our distribution system. With these anticipated funds the District continues to replace outdated equipment that has served the district for many years but now must be replaced to bring our hydrants up to current American Water works standards. Our replacement program systematically looks at our complete inventory of over 1,000 hydrants serving your our ratepayers with a vital protective component of any water supply system; excellent fire protection.

As always, your thoughts, concerns and ideas regarding the water you purchase and consume are of the highest priority for me. I'd like to thank all the residents of the Dracut Water Supply District who continue to support the efforts made on their behalf here the District. Remember no idea or suggestion is too small or insignificant to ignore when it is directed to enhance the supply of the highest water quality possible to you our customers and ratepayers. I am happy to listen to all your comments and suggestions and I look forward to yet another productive year here at the Dracut Water Supply District.

Report on access to District Property, via Roadway off of Hildreth Street

The action on Article 21 was referred back for a report to the May 2007 Annual. This was to provide access for a piece of land owned by Albert J. Gagnon, Jr. of 2104 Lakeview Avenue, Dracut, MA.

In particular this parcel was in fact abutted to by land now or formerly of the Gagnon Family. This rear parcel was divided off and access at one time was or could have been via the front parcel.

The applicant now approaches the District for authorization to use, as access, the District Roadway leading to the Hildreth Street Well Field aka New Boston Well Field.

The family had sold the front parcel of land, not recording or allowing access to the rear parcel effectively "land locking" their rear parcel.

Not withstanding other legal options to the applicant the issue now to be reported on is the request for use of the "Well Field Roadway" as access and frontage to this rear parcel. Insofar as this is concerned staff after reviewing this, the survey done and issues surrounding public use of the Well Field Road now must consider the following:

- 1. Liability exposure of the District for any and all authorized use of this Roadway.
- 2. Increase vehicular traffic in an environmentally sensitive area.
- 3. Security issues of the gate and fence currently installed as well as the upgrade required by the Board for permanent fencing and gating.
- 4. The increased potential for use of the well field roadways and areas as they abut this lot.

Considering the real potential for suit, injury and accident as well as the potential for a precedent which others would then be entitled to apply for is regretful but staff recommends that the petition not be considered. That no person shall be granted access for routine use of any District property as it is not in the interest of the District to create a potential for suit regarding such authorized use.

Commonly asked questions and concerns.

My water is cloudy? This condition is usually caused by a break somewhere in the line that required repair. This is simply air bubbles in the water and is harmless and should clear quickly.

<u>Is my water being treated?</u> Yes water in the Dracut Water Supply System is treated. We treat with phosphates and Potassium Hydroxide; this is to manage the pH level. This helps with balancing the naturally acidic water that is common in this area of the country. In addition we treat with fluoride.

I notice water coming up from the street or my yard, what should I do? This may be a leak or could be natural run off. Either way give us a call (978) 957-0441 we will be happy to check it out.

is there a water ban?

There is no water ban scheduled but we do provide for water conservation measures from Memorial Day-Labor Day. During this time water use outside is restricted on the following schedule. Odd numbered home addresses on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday. Even numbered home addresses are Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. No watering outside on Mondays. This helps us recover from the weekend use. With proper watering it is not necessary to use lawn sprinklers everyday. There is no time limit for outside use on your days. Please, however water wisely and conserve.

How am I billed? You are billed quarterly. A minimum quarterly bill is \$57.88 for 0 - 1,250 cubic feet of water. (A cubic foot of water is 7.5 gallons). If you stay under the minimum you are given a 10% credit. If you go over 1,250 cubic feet the charge is \$3.30 per 100 cubic feet (750 gallons) from 1251 - 5000 cubic feet and over 5,000 is \$4.08 per 100 cubic feet.
